

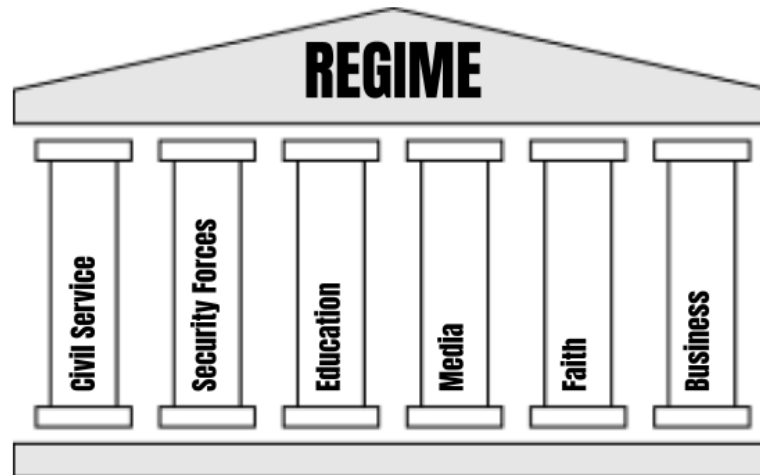

Understanding Pillars of Support



Authoritarianism is a system built on enforced obedience to a single leader or a small ruling circle. When that power rests in one person alone, it is often called autocracy. When it is concentrated in the hands of a wealthy elite, it becomes oligarchy.

Authoritarianism becomes fascism when power is fused with a mass political movement driven by rigid, ultra-nationalist, and exclusionary ideology. These systems overlap and reinforce one another. What they share is a dependence on repression, intimidation, and the steady erosion of democratic norms in order to survive.

But no authoritarian system stands alone. Every one of them depends on “pillars of support”—the military, the media, corporations, financial institutions, religious organizations, civic groups, and other centers of influence. These pillars provide legitimacy, money, workers, and enforcement. Without them, concentrated power cannot endure.

History shows that when these pillars shift—even slightly—the entire structure begins to weaken. Nonviolent movements succeed not by matching repression with force, but by persuading, organizing, and mobilizing people within those institutions to reconsider their support. When legitimacy erodes, control follows.

So ask yourself: Which pillars are you connected to? Where do you have influence—at work, in your community, in your faith organization, online, in professional networks? Change does not come from outrage alone. It comes from coordinated, strategic pressure applied across these pillars at the same time.

If we want a freer, more just, and more democratic country, we must recognize that power is sustained collectively—and it can be reshaped collectively.

Recap of this week

We had a great general meeting on 2/11. The events, community outreach, and legislative action committees met. At the events action committee, they began planning for No Kings III, which will be on March 28th!

No Kings III will be a peaceful demonstration, from OSU to the Courthouse starting at noon, with a march along Madison Ave. We are hoping to have multiple areas of engagement along the route.

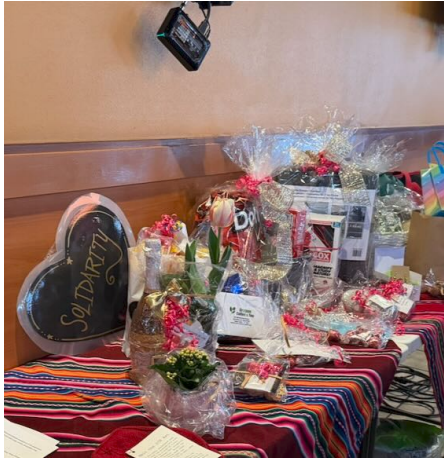
To pull this off, **we will need 100 safety volunteers, plus dozens of people** to set up tables, art, and sound equipment; staff information and first aid tables; and clean and pack up afterwards. To volunteer for the day of the event, please email indivisible.bc.or@gmail.com with the subject "No Kings volunteer" and indicate how you would like to be involved.

A core principle behind all No Kings events is a commitment to nonviolent action. Nonviolent peaceful action is not passive. It is a well-studied form of civil resistance that has been shown to be far more successful than the alternative. We expect all participants to seek to de-escalate any potential confrontation with those who disagree with our values and to act lawfully at these events. Weapons of any kind, including those legally permitted, should not be brought to events. We believe that safety and de-escalation is every participants' responsibility.

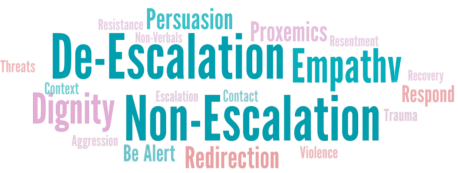
Thank you to everyone who participated and to the organizers who made the event possible. It was truly an uplifting gathering of our community, coming together in support of one another.

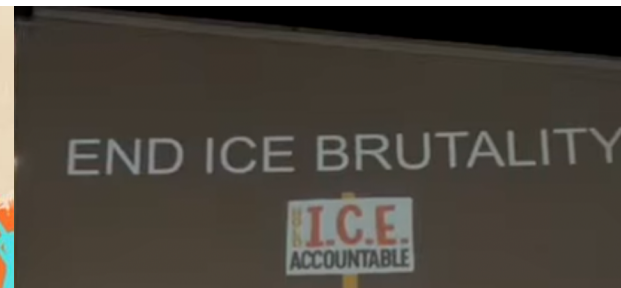

COMMUNITY ALERT

The PIRC hotline has seen an exponential increase in the number of calls we are receiving during this current assault on our communities. The hotline is staffed almost entirely by volunteers who are working around the clock to respond to this crisis. In order to help us meet the challenges of this moment and to center the most impacted, we have an ask of the community.

Please continue to CALL the hotline

window or closed door. Immigration can only enter your home with an arrest warrant signed by a judge

speaking loudly that you will not answer questions or sign any documents without a lawyer present.

DO NOT GIVE PERMISSION FOR SEARCH
You have the right to refuse permission for immigration authorities or police to enter or search your car or person unless they have a warrant signed by a judge.

REPORT ICE ACTIVITY TO THE COMMUNITY HOTLINE
PIRC will contact rapid response teams that will verify and document immigration activity and offer support to affected people.

TAKE PHOTOS, VIDEO AND/OR NOTES
Inform the officer that you will be using your right to record. Take photos, record the interaction, and write down the details.

CONFIRM NEWS AND RUMORS
Do not share unverified information, as this only creates fear. Ask people sharing news about ICE to share their sources and have witnesses call PIRC to verify.
